Aniridia

Aniridia (an-,ī-'rid-ē-ə) is an eye anomaly where the colored part of the eye (called the iris) is partly or totally missing. It usually affects both eyes. Other parts of the eye can also be formed incorrectly. The effects on children's ability to see can range from mild problems to blindness.
