

Cleft Lip and/or Palate

The most common birth anomalies of the face and mouth are cleft lip and cleft palate. In cleft lip, the baby's upper lip doesn't form completely and has an opening in it. In cleft palate, the baby's palate (roof of the mouth) does not form completely and has an opening in it. A child can be born with a cleft lip, a cleft palate or both. Treatment may include not only surgery to repair the cleft but also help with infant feeding, language and hearing, and special dentistry.

Although most causes of cleft lip and cleft palate are not well understood, some issues during early pregnancy can be related to cleft lip and cleft palate, including: taking certain medications, using tobacco or alcohol, certain infections, or having diabetes.
