ELIGIBILITY & BENEFITS

Fellowships are available for postdoctoral training in all scientific areas of study at OHSU. Priority will be given to individuals from historically underrepresented groups, based on research priority needs.

Fellows receive mentorship, grant writing assistance, and scholarly training. Also:

- Salary and benefits for first year of postdoctoral research (and support to seek other funding for additional years)
- Up to \$5000 for professional development and research materials
- Up to \$3000 for relocation costs
